Francia Marquez

Colombia's

first Black vice president-elect, Francia Márquez, has been a local leader and activist in the Cauca region since age thirteen. In 1994, she joined a resistance movement blocking industries from diverting the sacred Ovejas river and won.

This passion continued

a decade later as she led a women's march over 350 miles to protest gold mining in the Amazon. Márquez was awarded the Goldman Environmental Prize in 2018 for her efforts.

Strengthening Indigenous Territorial Management through Women-led Mapping Initiatives in Amazonia

The

Amazon rainforest is a biodiversity hotspot and a critical biome for maintaining the global climate system. For almost a decade, Digital Democracy has worked

closely with Indigenous groups in the Amazon to support their critical efforts in protecting and defending their ancestral territories. This project will create a peer-supported network for 12 Indigenous Women Earth Defenders from at least six different communities and Indigenous Nations in their efforts to protect more than two million acres of land.
