Featured Project: Securing Indigenous land rights through innovative mapping technology

In Kenya, the Ogiek People of Mount Elgon are engaged in a legal struggle to reestablish their ancestral lands taken by colonization. Inspired by Indigenous communities in the Amazon using maps in court, in 2019, the Ogiek decided to start mapping with support from Digital Democracy and Forest Peoples Programme.

Spearheaded by the Ogiek organization, the Chepkitale Indigenous People Development Project (CIPDP) and their women-led field mapping team, the community has mapped thousands of places and significant sites, covering more than 42,000 hectares of their land. Now, they want to share their extensive mapping knowledge and skills with other communities.
