Electronics engineer Jovie Gil Montajes is helping to sustainably light up rural communities in the Philippines through his Light of Hope project. Many people in the island nation cannot always connect to the power grid, leaving the most vulnerable members of the community to rely on combustible energy sources that emit carbon dioxide and black carbon. The Light of Hope project is transforming lives by providing communities with a clean and inexpensive source of light - inexpensive solar-powered night lamps created from discarded plastic bottles. ## Featured Project: Providing Emergency Relief for Clean Energy Entrepreneurs Working on 'Last Mile' Access in Uganda

In Uganda, 78% of the rural population lacks access to electricity, leaving most to rely on kerosene lamps for lighting which are inefficient, expensive, and produce toxic fumes. A project supported by New Energy Nexus is changing this by helping local entrepreneurs equip those in need with clean energy products.
