The Cemetery continues for approximately one mile north in over 300 undeveloped acres.

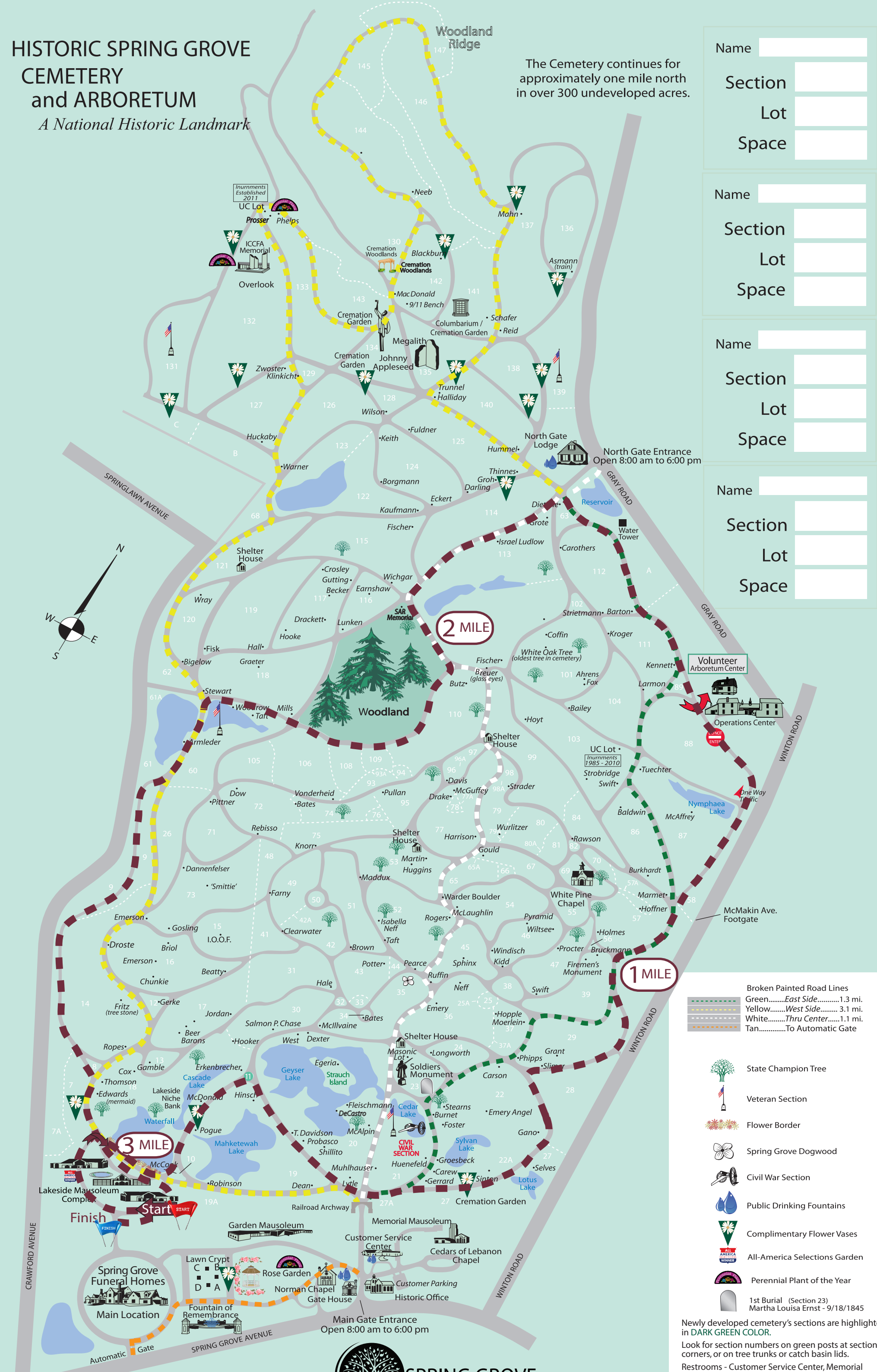
